Yes. Called objections to Arizona's electoral votes <u>"baseless."</u> Says state's <u>"elections were fairly</u> <u>administered and certified by a Republican Governor</u> <u>and public servants at every level."</u> Increase. Supports <u>upgrading state infra-structure, job</u> <u>training, and investing in microchip manufacturing</u> . Voted for a <u>\$300-per-child monthly tax credit</u> in the <u>American Rescue Plan</u> . No. <u>Cosponsored a bill</u> to make Election Day a federal	Elections Did Joe Biden legitimately win the 2020 Presidential election? Yes. Co-sponsored a bipartisan bill <u>to use voluntary</u> environmental credit markets to reward farmers for <u>sustainable practices. Voted for \$369 billion in clean</u> <u>energy subsidies</u> in the Inflation Reduction Act. <u>"We</u> <u>can't ignore climate change. The drought conditions in</u> <u>the West are too severe for us not to act."</u>	<u>Climate Change</u> Should climate change be a top priority? Tax or limit output of greenhouse gases, or support renewable energy?	No. <u>"We traded energy independence for climate</u> <u>change activism."</u> <u>"I don't think there's any sort of</u> <u>public health or climate science legitimate</u> <u>perspective."</u> Compares <u>environmental</u> , <u>social</u> , <u>and</u> <u>governance (ESG) scores that assess corporate</u> <u>environmental practices to tactics of the Chinese</u> <u>Communist Party.</u>
More. <u>"I'm a gun person,a strong supporter of the</u> <u>2nd Amendment," but "we have been dumb about this</u> <u>issue for so many years."</u> Supports <u>"things like</u> <u>background checks, we know that works."</u>	<u>Gun Laws</u> Pass less or more restrictive legislation on guns?	Less. Opposes 2022 rule limiting ghost gun production. Opposes red flag laws that temporarily remove guns from people deemed by a court to be a threat. Blames gun violence on <u>"people in Chicago, St</u> Louis, shooting each other. Very often, you know, Black people, frankly."
Yes. Supports <u>full funding for Medicare and</u> <u>Medicaid</u> but <u>not "Medicare for All."</u> Voted for the Inflation Reduction Act, <u>which caps Medicare drug</u> <u>costs and empowers Medicare to negotiate drug</u> <u>prices.</u> Supports CDC's recommendations on <u>face</u> <u>masks and vaccines.</u>	<u>Health Care</u> Increase government role in health care, such as expanding Medicaid, limiting drug prices, or promoting COVID safety?	No. Called <u>the Inflation Reduction Act</u> , with provisions for lowering Medicare drug costs, <u>"a</u> <u>disaster."</u> Called <u>COVID vaccine mandates "evil."</u> Has said that <u>he supports limiting contraceptive access.</u>
<u>"The goal must be to end any uncertainty and provide</u> <u>Dreamers with a pathway to citizenship."</u>	Immigration How to handle immigration? Support a path to citizenship for "DACA" participants brought to the US as children?	<u>"I will oppose granting U.S. citizenship to those who</u> <u>come to America illegally.</u> " Democrats <u>"want to give</u> <u>mass amnesty in return for votes," want "to turn</u> <u>these people into voters."</u>
More. Voted for the Inflation Reduction Act; it closes <u>"loopholes to make sure that companies with</u> <u>more than a billion dollars in profit pay their fair share,</u> <u>and it cracks down on the wealthiest trying to cheat</u> <u>the system."</u>	<u>Taxes</u> Should corporations and wealthier individuals pay less or more taxes?	Unclear. Is <u>"open to" billionaires paying more in</u> <u>taxes.</u> Has suggested that wealthy people might willingly pay more taxes if <u>"the government was</u> <u>spending money wisely"</u> to help Americans.
Legal. <u>Voted for the Women's Health Protection Act of</u> <u>2021</u> , which would codify abortion access in federal law. <u>"I am resolved to defend and protect the right of</u> <u>Arizona women to make their own health care</u> <u>decisions.</u> "	<u>Abortion</u> Ban or legal?	Ban. <u>"Roe v. Wade needs to be repealed.</u> " Supports a <u>federal personhood law</u> recognizing <u>"unborn babies</u> <u>are human beings that may not be killed.</u> " In a 2022 questionnaire, said is <u>"100% pro</u> <u>life;</u> " supports <u>abortion bans with no exceptions</u> . More recently, called the state's 15-week ban <u>"reasonable;</u> " said he approves of <u>Arizona's exception</u> <u>for life of the mother</u> .
