Does the candidate promote the freedom to vote?

Does the candidate uphold election integrity and deny false allegations of voter fraud?

Pope Francis says...

We cannot avoid noting with concern how we are witnessing a retreat from democracy... Universal participation is essential; not simply to attain shared goals but also because it corresponds to what we are: social beings, at once unique and interdependent.

DISCRIMINATION

Does the candidate oppose racial, ethnic, and religious discrimination?

Does the candidate believe housing, health care, and food are a human right?

Does the candidate oppose discrimination against the LGBTQ+ community?

Does the candidate oppose the death penalty?

101. Our defense of the innocent unborn, for example, needs to be clear, firm, and passionate. Equally sacred, however, are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the underprivileged, and every form of rejection.

CLIMATE CHANGE

Does the candidate support policies that address climate change?

Pope Francis says...

67. Each community can take from the bounty of the earth what it needs for subsistence, but it also has the duty to protect the earth and to ensure its fruitfulness for coming generations.

RACISM

Does the candidate recognize racist policies and work to undo them?

Pope Francis says...

We cannot tolerate or turn a blind eye to racism and exclusion in any form and yet claim to defend the sacredness of every human life.

POVERTY

Does the candidate support raising the minimum wage?

Does the candidate support extending the Child Tax Credit?

Does the candidate support making sure the wealthy pay what they owe in taxes?

Does the candidate protect workers' right to organize?

Pope Francis says...

53. Today we also have to say "thou shalt not" to an economy of exclusion and inequality. Such an economy kills. *Evangelii Gaudium - November 2013*

IMMIGRATION

Does the candidate welcome immigrants and support a legal and humane immigration system?

Pope Francis says...

102. We often hear it said that the situation of migrants is a lesser issue. Some Catholics consider it a secondary issue compared to the "grave" bioethical questions. That a politician looking for votes might say such a thing is understandable, but not a Christian, for whom the only proper attitude is to stand in the shoes of those brothers and sisters of ours who risk their lives to offer a future to their children.
